

## SHIBA volunteers can help with Medicare questions

SOUTH COAST — Have you ever wondered what supplemental Medicare insurance is the right for you? Do you have questions about your Medicare Part D coverage? Do you get discouraged about the confusing information you read to enroll in Medicare? The Senior Health Insurance Benefit Assistance volunteers in Coos County have you covered.

The Coos County SHIBA Program, sponsored by Coast Community Health Center, welcomes Cynthia Hylton, SHIBA field officer from the Oregon Insurance Division. Hylton's Medicare 101 class covers the basics of Medicare part A, B, C and D. The class is designed for anyone eligible for Medicare within the 2015 open enrollment period or anyone new to Medicare.

The class is also open for current beneficiaries seeking a better understanding of their benefits and options for changes or additional coverage. Spouses and other relatives are also welcome.
